



Parson to Person

Dear Church Family and Friends,

In the 10th chapter of Mark's Gospel, we find the story of Blind Bartimaeus. When Bartimaeus heard that Jesus was coming his way, he began to cry out and call for Jesus. Despite the attempts of the crowd to silence the blind man, Jesus heard his cry and came to the rescue.

I remember the story of a young twelve-year-old girl named Terri who was from a small town here in the Midwest. She was babysitting her young brother and went out to the mailbox to check the mail. As she turned back, she couldn't believe her eyes. Their little house was on fire and it had quickly become engulfed in flames with her baby brother trapped inside. Terri ran as fast as she could into the burning house, only to find that the boy had been trapped by a piece of rafter that had fallen off and pinned him to the floor.

Terri worked as fast as she could to free her brother. She had trouble getting him loose and the flames were dancing ever more closely around her head. Finally, she managed to get him free and she quickly took him outside. Very soon afterwards, the roof of the little house collapsed. By now there were firemen on the scene. Some revived the boy while others battled the blaze.

As the neighbors gathered around the girl, they congratulated her and praised her bravery. They had been too afraid to enter the building themselves, but as they bragged on her heroic efforts, they asked, "Terri, weren't you afraid? What were you thinking about when you ran into the burning house?" Terri replied, "I wasn't thinking about anything. I just heard my little brother crying."

Let me ask you something. How long has it been? How long since you stopped to listen? How long since you've heard the cries of your brother or sister around you? How long since you stopped and tried to do something about it?

Due to covid, the women of the Sarah Circle are again unable to have our annual salad luncheon to raise monies for various Children's Homes. For numerous years, in the past we have been able to send money to these homes for children at Christmas:

Chaddock Children's Home in Quincy, IL– It's a home funded by the United Methodist Churches. They provide all kinds of services to young children and teens.

Putting Prayers In Action, Big Clifty, KY– They are funded by donations and volunteers for babies through teens in poverty stricken areas surrounding their distribution center. This area was where our mission team worked in July of 2019.

Cunningham Children's Home, Urbana, IL– This home is funded by the Women of the UM Churches and the State of Illinois as they provide services to local public school children. They operate several homes on campus. Many of professional people working there, provide the exact needs for these children who come to them angry, abused, neglected and in need of careful guidance.


Spero Family Services– This is formerly Mr. Bernon's Children's Home located in Mt. Vernon, IL. They are providing more attention to the teenage children, as they feel there is a great need at the present time. They are funded by UM Churches.
